Mountaineers (15-2, 4-1)

No. 7 West Virginia Looks to Remain Undefeated at Home vs. OU

- With 806 wins, Bob Huggins is tied with Eddie Sutton for ninth place all-time in NCAA victories.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 806-323 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino by two wins and Jim Phelan by 24 wins.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 113-30 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 57-26 mark in league games.
- WVU is 522-150 (.781) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 154-36 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins at the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 80.8 ppg while holding its opponents to 61.7 ppg.
- The Mountaineers have won 71 of their last 100 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the eighth-largest margin victory ever against a No. 1-ranked AP team.
- WVU is 5-1 in its last six games against AP Top 25 teams, including two wins over No. 1 and two wins over No. 6.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 27-13 in the Big 12 in the last two-plus seasons.
- West Virginia is 149-33 in its last 182 games against unranked teams, including 78 of its last 87 at the WVU Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 97-70 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 53-40 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 43-34 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- WVU leads the country in scoring margin (26.7), turnover margin (13.3), turnovers forced (24.3) and steals (12.6). WVU ranks third in offensive rebounds (15.5), fifth in assists (18.2), fifth in scoring offense (89.1), and 16th in scoring defense (62.4).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 in steals (fourth nationally), while Nathan Adrian ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- WVU's plus/minus leaders are Tarik Phillip (+312), Jevon Carter (+301), Nathan Adrian (+298) and Esa Ahmad (+243).
- WVU is averaging 47.6 deflections per game -- 49.4 deflections in its wins and 35.5 deflections in its losses.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but two Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals eight times in 2016-17.
- Baylor's 29 turnovers were the most forced by WVU in a league game in 24 years (30 vs. St. Bonaventure in 1992).
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 31.8 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.81 points per possession, tops in the country.
- WVU has forced more turnovers (413) than its opponents have made field goals (360).
- WVU has attempted 243 more shots than its opponents this season -- 1,120 to 8877.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 33 of the last 44 games. This year's team is averaging 38.9 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 71 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 28 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 27 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 44 of the last 47 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 47 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 53 of their last 54 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 174-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 63 of its last 65 and 119 of its last 130 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 575 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 55 times under Bob Huggins (328 games).
- West Virginia is 59-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 169-28 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 176-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 149-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 160-28 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 158-37 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 17-13 all-time on Jan. 18 and 501-320 all-time in the month of January.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 806 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 10th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Oklahoma

- Oklahoma is 7-9 overall and 1-4 in the Big 12 Conference following an 84-75 win over Texas Tech on Saturday.
- The Sooners had lost seven in a row prior to their win over Texas Tech.
- Oklahoma is 0-3 on the road this season, including an 0-2 mark in Big 12 road games.
- Lon Kruger, a 1975 graduate of K-State, is 118-66 in his sixth year at OU. He is 597-370 in 31 years overall.

Series Record Against Oklahoma

- Oklahoma holds an 8-4 series advantage against the Mountaineers.
- The Sooners won both regular season meetings last year. WVU defeated Oklahoma in the Big 12 Championship semifinals last season. The Sooners have won three of the last four meetings in the series.
- West Virginia is 2-2 against Oklahoma in the WVU Coliseum.
- The first meeting took place on March 22, 2005, a 92-68 WVU win over the No. 7-ranked Sooners in Oklahoma City in the All-College Classic.
- Bob Huggins is 6-9 all-time against the Sooners: 2-1 at Akron, 1-0 at Kansas State and 3-8 at West Virginia.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,717-1,061 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.

Recap

The Mountaineers held Buddy Hield to just six points on 1-of-8 shooting as the Mountaineers pulled off a dramatic 69-67 victory over sixth-ranked Oklahoma to advance to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship game against top-ranked Kansas.

It took the Mountaineers about five extra minutes to learn their fate when, following a Jonathan Holton free throw with 1.8 seconds left that gave West Virginia a two-point lead, Oklahoma got the ball to Hield and he let one fly from about half court.

The ball banked in and Hield and his Oklahoma teammates ran up in the crowd and celebrated with Sooner fans. However, when the game's three officials went to the replay monitor, they determined that time had expired before the ball had left Hield's hand.

For 34 minutes, West Virginia was in complete control of the game and it was doing so by sending waves of defenders at Hield and forcing Oklahoma to turn the basketball over a season-high 21 times.

Isaiah Cousins had a nightmarish night with seven turnovers, Hield and Dinjyl Walker finished with three each, while three other Sooner players had two turnovers.

Oklahoma's ball handling woes led to an 11-point West Virginia lead with 6:29 remaining and it appeared the Mountaineers were in great shape coming down the stretch with a much deeper bench.

Cousins got a three to go down with 6:10 left to make it 61-53. Then, two free throws by Cousins with 5:41 remaining reduced the lead to six.

A Christian James basket with 4:44 made it a four-point game, and then two more free throws by James got OU's deficit down to two, 61-59.

Another empty offensive possession by West Virginia opened the door for Oklahoma to take the lead, and it did on James' second three with 2:55 to make it 62-61, Oklahoma.

West Virginia's Tarik Phillip finally ended the scoring drought with a conventional three-point play when he was fouled by Ryan Spangler as he made a layup.

Cousins answered with a three to give OU back the lead with 2:12 left, and the Sooners got it to three on a pair of James free throws with 1:47 to go.

Jaysean Paige was fouled by Spangler going to the basket, hit two free throws with 54 seconds to reduce Oklahoma's lead to one, 67-66.

Cousins missed at the other end, Phillip got the rebounds and Paige was able to get a short jumper to go down with 11 seconds left to put West Virginia back in the lead, 68-67.

Recap

Buddy Hield scored 29 points to lead third-ranked Oklahoma to a 76-62 victory over 10th-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum. In fact, Hield was so good his 29 points were six more than West Virginia's entire starting lineup, which finished with just 23.

Oklahoma did a good job of handling West Virginia's pressure, turning the ball over only nine times, and the Sooners were also able to grab 18 offensive rebounds, many of those leading to wide open threes from Hield, who made five, Isaiah Cousins, who made two and Dinjyl Walker, who hit a big one in the second half.

Oklahoma (21-5, 9-5) had a 48-37 advantage on the glass, which kept the Sooners close until their shooters found their stroke.

OU missed its first nine three-point field goal tries before Cousins finally got one to go down with 8:10 left in the first half. After that, the Sooners hit seven of 18 from behind the arc and led for a vast majority of the game.

"They just absolutely dominated us on the glass," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "We just did not rebound the ball."

West Virginia's best stretch came right at the start of the second half when the Mountaineers used an 11-3 flurry right out of the gate to take a 37-31 lead.

Devin Williams got one to go down dose to the basket, Nathan Adrian made a steal on the inbound pass, scored a layup and a technical foul was called on Jordan Woodard during the play, leading to a pair of Tarik Phillip free throws. Williams hit another shot dose to the basket and Jevon Carter made a three - his only made field goal in 10 attempt.

But Adrian was called for his third foul, the Mountaineers subbed in four new players and that led to an 8-0 Oklahoma run and the lead once again.

The game was tied at 52 with 7:49 remaining when Jaysean Paige converted a driving layup, but the Sooners used a 24-10 run the rest of the way to send an overflow crowd of 15,289 - the seventh-largest in Coliseum history - home disappointed.

Phillip led West Virginia with 17 points coming off the bench, while Paige added 13 and Williams scored 10. Jonathan Holton contributed nine points while grabbing a team-best 11 rebounds.

Guard Daxter Miles Jr. missed his second straight game after suffering a hamstring injury against TCU and Paige was less than 100 percent playing on a tender ankle he sprained at Texas.

Recap

Khadeem Lattin's tip-in basket with 2.8 seconds left lifted second-ranked Oklahoma to a 70-68 victory over No. 11 West Virginia at Lloyd Noble Center in Norman, Oklahoma.

The Mountaineers fought back from seven points down with 4:33 left to tie it with 26 seconds remaining on a pair of Jonathan Holton free throws.

Following an Oklahoma timeout, the Sooners' Jordan Woodard attempted a contested jumper from outside the key and the ball hit off the back of the rim where Lattin was able to jump over Holton to tip in the winning shot.

After Lattin's basket, WVU had the ball with 2.8 seconds left but Devin Williams' inbound pass to Jevon Carter was tipped out of bounds by Buddy Hield, leaving just 0.9 seconds left on the clock and forcing Carter to attempt a length-of-the-floor throw that missed everything as the horn sounded.

After the Sooners scored the first seven points of the game, West Virginia recovered to take an 18-13 lead midway through the first half on a Daxter Miles Jr. layup. But Oklahoma made up the difference from the free throw line where the Sooners hit 12 during one stretch in the first half to tie the game at 34 by halftime.

OU scored the first five points of the second half before Nathan Adrian answered with a three, and after an Isaiah Cousins jumper, West Virginia went on an 11-0 run to take its biggest lead of the game, 49-41, with 13:49 remaining.

Then Buddy Hield, who scored 17 - nine below his season average - was fouled by Miles Jr. while attempting a wild 3-point shot as the shot dock was winding down. He was awarded three free throws on the play, making all three, to reduce West Virginia's lead to four.

Jordan Woodard then turned a Miles Jr. turnover into three more points from behind the arc at the other end to give OU a 55-51 lead. The Sooners eventually got it to seven on more free throws, these coming from Cousins, Spangler and Lattin with 4:32 remaining.

With Oklahoma leading, 66-61, the two teams traded baskets, Devin Williams tipping in Tarik Phillip's miss and Woodard hitting a jumper at the other end for OU.

Then Jaysean Paige's three from the wing pulled West Virginia to within two, 68-66, at 1:46 and Holton tied it with 26 seconds remaining.

The game basically came down to a free throw shooting contest - the Sooners making theirs (27 of 32) while the Mountaineers missing some critical ones (13 of 22), particularly in the second half.

Recap

Baylor, which reached No. 1 in both major polls a day earlier for the first time in school history, ran into "Press" Virginia in Morgantown and the 10th-ranked Mountaineers ran away with a surprisingly easy 89-68 victory over the Bears.

It was the second consecutive year West Virginia has knocked off No. 1 at home in January. In 2015-16, it was top-ranked Kansas which succumbed to the Mountaineers, 74-63.

Nathan Adrian scored a career-high 22 points, grabbed six rebounds, made three steals and handed out two assists in a terrific all-around performance. The Morgantown High graduate made seven-of-10 from the field, knocked down a pair of 3s and also hit six-of-nine from the free throw line in one of the best all-around efforts.

Carter, too, stepped up and played wonderfully by scoring 17, handing out seven assists and producing a game-high five steals. Carter hounded Baylor's guards the entire night and was a major reason why the Bears turned the ball over a staggering 29 times.

Eight of the 11 players who got into the game for Baylor had multiple turnovers, including six by forward Ishmail Wainright.

West Virginia (14-2, 3-1) led Baylor (15-1, 3-1) throughout, and the Mountaineers had plenty of chances to extend their lead in the first half, but the Bears stuck around by beating West Virginia on the glass. The rebounding disparity was 12 in the Baylor's favor, and that minimized to some extent the 16 turnovers they committed in the first 20 minutes of play.

The Mountaineers began the game strong and took an early 11-point lead before Baylor began chipping away, gradually reducing its deficit to four with 2:31 remaining.

In the second half, Baylor scored first on a Wainright layup but Watkins answered with a jumper. Another Watkins jumper pushed the lead to nine and soon it was 13 on a quick 7-0 spur, capped by a pair of Esa Ahmad layups.

A Watkins dunk made it 57-43, and then a Tarik Phillip jumper with 9:36 remaining gave West Virginia a 15-point advantage. A Miles Jr. follow-up dunk pushed the margin to 21, but he was called for a technical foul for hanging on the rim, giving Baylor free throws at the other end.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 26 points, twice, before Huggins began emptying his bench.

A sellout crowd of 14,632 watched the game.

Notebook

- The victory over Baylor is the fifth time in school history West Virginia has defeated No. 1. The other instances were against North Carolina (1957), Duke (1966), UNLV (1983) and Kansas (2016).

Recap

Teyvon Myers scored a career-high 16 points and Jevon Carter added 17 to lead 10th-ranked West Virginia to a 74-72 victory at the Erwin Center in Austin, Texas.

Texas, with leading scorer Tevin Mack, had a six-point lead with 10:40 remaining in the game when Andrew Jones made one of his four 3-point baskets.

Two Myers free throws, and a Tarik Phillip traditional three-point basket sliced the Texas lead to one in a matter 35 seconds. Another Phillip basket after he stole the ball from Kerwin Roach Jr. gave West Virginia a 54-53 lead.

Another Jones 3 tied the game at 60 with 6:55 to go but that's when Carter took over. A Carter free throw and then a steal in the open court led to a short jumper and a three-point lead.

Two more Carter free throws, coming after a terrific Sagaba Konate block on Shaquille Cleare's turnaround jumper put West Virginia up by five, 65-60, with 3:52 left.

Another Carter jumper with 2:28 remaining answered Allen's jumper to make it 68-65. Carter scored again with 1:42 left after two Roach Jr. free throws.

A key play came with 43 seconds left when Nathan Adrian, battling a virus, managed to grab Phillip's missed 3 and was fouled by Allen. Adrian hit both free throws to put West Virginia ahead by four.

Two Carter free throws with 22 seconds left gave West Virginia enough room to hold on for a two-point road win.

After trailing for most of the first half, WVU used a 22-13 run over the remaining 7:09 of the half to take a five-point lead at halftime.

Phillip contributed 14, giving West Virginia 30 points from its two guards coming off the bench.

That made up for Dexter Miles Jr.'s struggles from the floor. The junior missed all six of his 3-point field goal tries and finished with seven.

Adrian finished with eight points and six rebounds, but spent a good portion of the first half on the bench with foul trouble.

Allen led everyone with 19 points on six of seven shooting. Jones finished with 17 before fouling out with 3:23 remaining.

Texas (7-10, 1-4) made eight 3s and shot 47.9 percent from the floor. The Longhorns committed 19 turnovers, but West Virginia was only able to score 21 points off those turnovers.

The Mountaineers were a frigid four of 18 from 3 against primarily a zone defense.

Notebook

- West Virginia won for the second time in five tries in Austin. The first victory came in 2013, an overtime victory in WVU's first season in the Big 12.
