## No. 7 West Virginia Continues Road Swing at Texas Tech

- This is the fourth year in a row WVU has opened league play with two straight road games. WVU has started with at least a 2-0 league record the last three years, including a 4-0 start to league play last season.
- WVU has started 12-1 for the third consecutive year. Last year's team started 15-1 and the 2015 team started 14-1.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 25-12 in the Big 12 in the last two-plus seasons.
- WVU is 11-5 all-time in games played in Texas. All 16 of those games have been since WVU joined the Big 12 in 2012.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in 10th place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 803-322 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino and Eddie Sutton by three wins.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 147-32 in its last 179 games against unranked teams, including 77 of its last 86 at the Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins has posted 39 conference road victories in 10 seasons at WVU, including a win at Oklahoma State on Dec. 30, six Big 12 road wins last season and four Big 12 road wins two years ago.
- West Virginia is 94-69 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 50-39 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 40-33 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Bob Huggins has won 102 out of his 213 games at WVU away from home.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia was its first over a Top 10 team in a true non-conference road game since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU leads the country in scoring margin (32.3), turnover margin (15.2), turnovers forced (25.6) and steals (13.5). WVU ranks fourth in offensive rebounds (16.0), fifth in scoring offense (91.8), fifth in assists (18.9) and 11th in scoring defense (59.5).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 Conference in steals, while Nathan Adrian ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but one Mountaineer opponent has had at least 19 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals seven times in 2016-17.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 33.3 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.77 points per possession, tops in the country.
- WVU has forced more turnovers (334) than its opponents have made field goals (263).
- WVU has taken 196 more shots than its opponents this season -- 868 to 672.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 31 of the last 40 games. This year's team is averaging 42.4 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA appearance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU has made 12 postseason appearances in the last 13 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 69 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 26 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history. Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked for 60 weeks during his career.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 25 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 42 of the last 45 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 45 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 52 of their last 53 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 571 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 54 times under Bob Huggins (324 games).
- WVU is 173-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 62 of its last 64 and 118 of its last 129 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 59-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 166-27 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 174-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 148-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 157-27 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 156-36 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 20-11 all-time on Jan. 3 and 498-319 all-time in the month of January.

## Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 803 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 10th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

## Scouting Texas Tech

- Texas Tech is 11-2 overall and 0-1 in the Big 12 Conference following a 63-56 loss at Iowa State on Friday.
- The Red Raiders had won eight in a row prior to the game at Iowa State.
- Texas Tech is 9-0 at United Supermarkets Arena this season.
- Chris Beard is in his first season at Texas Tech. He is 182-52 in his eighth season as a head coach.

## Series Record Against Texas Tech

- This will be the 11th meeting between West Virginia and Texas Tech with WVU leading 9-1.
- The Mountaineers have won the last six meetings, including an 80-76 win at Tech and 90-68 in Morgantown last year.
- The first meeting took place in the NCAA Sweet 16 on March 24, 2005 in Albuquerque, N.M. The Mountaineers defeated the Red Raiders, 65-60. WVU then narrowly lost in overtime to Louisville two days later for a spot in the Final Four.
- WVU is 8-0 against Texas Tech in Big 12 regular season games. WVU is 4-0 against Tech in Lubbock.
- Texas Tech's lone win in the series was a 71-69 decision in the 2013 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship opening round.
- Bob Huggins is 9-2 against Texas Tech: 8-1 at West Virginia and 1-1 while he was at Kansas State.

## WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,714-1,060 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.

Recap

Tenth-ranked West Virginia shot 50 percent from the floor for the first time since defeating Texas Tech back on January 23 in Lubbock, and 10 different players got into the scoring column as the Mountaineers rolled to a 90-68 victory over the Red Raiders on Senior Night at the WVU Coliseum for Jonathon Holton, Jaysean Paige and Richard Romeo III.

Paige scored 15 points in his final Coliseum appearance. Holton had seven points and 11 rebounds, and Romeo III played the final 3:19 and scored a basket.

With the exception of Texas Tech's early 2-0 lead, the Mountaineers led for all but 52 seconds and used a 17-4 run over the remaining 5:55 of the first half to build a 41-26 advantage at the break.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 27 points late in the second half. "I thought we played extremely hard and for a stretch in the first half and a stretch in the second half we ran pretty good offense," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "We have our spells when we don't, but I guess everybody does."

All of the Mountaineers' strengths as a basketball team showed up during the game. West Virginia outrebounded the Red Raiders, 40-23, including 19 on the offensive glass, forced Texas Tech into 19 turnovers and took 27 more shots than the Red Raiders.

"I thought our pressure was pretty good," said Huggins. "That crew [Texas Tech] has played really well [of late] and I thought we really took them out of what they wanted to do."

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 15 points, including five-of-10 from 3. Nathan Adrian contributed 13 points on six-of-eight shooting, and Tarik Phillip came off the bench to contribute 13.

WVU played so efficiently that it didn't need second-leading scorer Devin Williams' 13 points per game. The junior did not start for the first time this season, and he didn't score until 47 seconds remained in the game.

Justin Gray led Texas Tech with 15 points.

Recap

Sixth-ranked West Virginia stole a basketball game at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas, against Texas Tech. And West Virginia's chief thief was Tarik Phillip.

The junior guard came up with two critical steals and baskets late in the game to power the Mountaineers to an 80-76 come-from-behind victory over the fired-up Red Raiders.

Phillip's biggest steal happened with 30 seconds left in the game when Aaron Ross was driving in for a layup to put Texas Tech back in the lead. Phillip stripped the ball out of Ross' hands and turned Ross' turnover into a twisting layup at the other end for a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Zach Smith.

That made the score, 78-76, West Virginia with 24 seconds remaining.

Following a Texas Tech timeout, Toddric Gotcher got a good look at a three to put Texas Tech back into the lead; he missed, and Phillip eventually managed to come up with the basketball at midcourt where he drove in for a dunk to punctuate an unlikely victory for West Virginia.

With 2:26 remaining in the game that did not seem likely. The Red Raiders were celebrating Gray's short jumper in the lane to put them ahead, 72-67, forcing West Virginia coach Bob Huggins to call timeout 14 seconds later to get his team organized for a critical offensive possession.

What came out of that was a Daxter Miles Jr. three to make it a two-point game.

After two Keenan Evans free throws for Texas Tech - two of the 32 the Red Raiders made this afternoon on 34 attempts - Jaysean Paige matched those with a pair of free throws at the other end with 1:14 to go.

Four seconds later, Devin Williams was called for his fifth foul, this one on Zach Smith, who sank two more free throws to make it 76-72, Texas Tech.

That's when Phillip took over. He banged home a three from the wing with 56 seconds left to make it a one-point game, 76-75, and then he alertly stripped the ball out of Ross' hands as he was going in to score the go-ahead basket.

Phillip took the ball the length of the court and got his layup to go down with Smith all over him. Smith was called for a foul and Phillip hit the free throw. Phillip also scored on a breakaway dunk to tally the final eight points of the game.

Recap

A balanced offensive attack featuring five double-figure scorers powered 14th-ranked West Virginia to a 78-67 victory over Texas Tech at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

Juwan Staten, back in the lineup after missing the game at TCU because of a flu-like virus, scored 16 points, although he was just 6-of-15 from the floor and 3-of-8 from the free throw line.

"The best thing about tonight is we won and we don't have to come back here this year," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. Sophomore forward Devin Williams played another strong game, scoring 14 points and grabbing six rebounds. It was Williams who Huggins chose to go to early in the second half when the Mountaineer offense was stagnant and the game was tied.

Williams scored the first five points after intermission before the rest of the team warmed up. Staten, Daxter Miles Jr., Gary Browne and Staten hitting field goals in succession to help the Mountaineers build an eight-point lead.

"We wanted to throw the ball to [Williams] and kind of get him going," said Huggins. "He played a really good second half. In the second half he let the game come to him."

West Virginia's biggest lead was 15 with 10 minutes remaining. The margin never dipped below eight the rest of the way.

The Mountaineers nearly shot as well from the floor (48.6 percent) as they did from the free throw line (56.0 percent), but fortunately, Texas Tech was also shooting bricks. The Red Raiders missed 15 free throws and finished the game shooting 59.5 percent from the line.

Freshman guard Jevon Carter had a nice stat line for the Mountaineers: 11 points, three rebounds, two assists and four steals in 21 minutes of action.

West Virginia forced Tech into 22 turnovers and had a 63-46 advantage in field goal attempts.

The two teams were even on the glass, 35-35. Devaught Williams led everyone with 21 points, going 8-of-11 from the floor and 3-of-4 from 3. Toddric Gotcher added 14 for the Red Raiders, now 10-5, 0-2.

### Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on four-of-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or more.

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six steals.

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

### Notebook

- The Mountaineers now own a 93-15 all-time record in season openers, including a 99-9 record in home openers.
- The crowd of 10,510 was the fifth time in Coliseum history that WVU had a crowd of 10,000 or more in the month of November.
- Tarik Phillip made his first career start as a Mountaineer.

### Recap

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

"It feels good to win any first," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Maverick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists. West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down.

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers.

### Recap

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory.

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one. Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa Ahmad 3.

Another 3, this one by Dexter Miles Jr. from NBA range, pulled WVU to within two, 62-60, and Teyvon Myers tied the game at 62 on a driving layup.

Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in close.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enechionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up short.

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 1.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

### Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia. The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country. WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14. WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead. Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tank Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55. Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left. Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense. A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Dexter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22. A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half. West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

### Notebook

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008.
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesville for the first time since 1975.

### Recap

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory. Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers. A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead. The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Dexter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn. Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored. The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half. "I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. ### Recap

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67. Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino. Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball.

Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players. Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches, rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony.

As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor. The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame. With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction. Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakaway dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic double play.

Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points. The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers. UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

### Notebook

- UMKC was the 171st different team to play a game against WVU in the Coliseum (non-exhibition).
- WVU is now 135-36 against teams making their first appearance in the Coliseum.
- WVU is now 2-0 against teams from the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The other WAC team WVU faced was New Mexico State in 2007 in Newark, New Jersey.

## Recap

Eleventh-ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams.

With the exception Lucas N'Guessan's dunk to begin the game, Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil Forte.

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor.

Forte led Oklahoma State with 18.

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation. Macon was a late scratch after suffering a knee injury in the win against Northern Kentucky.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players - Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West - added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better-than-usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe.

Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7. Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7.

The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61, West Virginia.

Some late 3s from Forte kept the margin under 20.

## Notebook

- The Mountaineers have now won five straight against the Cowboys dating back to the 2014-15 season.
- WVU has won its last four Big 12 openers, all on the road.
